In July, Dennis was in Lille, France for its first *Strategic Life Training* (*SLT*) Intensive, followed by their second Transforum, which stands for "A forum for transformation".

"It seems to us that it was the deepest penetration of the message of the Kingdom we have seen; we are filled with hope for the future the Lord has prepared for our great nation," said Jean-Marc Potenti, who leads our partnering organization in France, ID2R.

The focus of the conference was on social entitlements and economic policy in France. The country faces massive debt and an over-extended government, as well as a general deterioration of the family unit. "The leaders coming out of these teaching times are going to be the ones helping shape the debate," Dennis said.

A vision to reach French-speaking countries began when several people from Switzerland attended the first *SLT* Intensive in 1995.

They expressed an interest in having the program offered in their country. The goal was to offer the schools and other SCS materials in German and French, and as a critical mass was built, to expand to other nations.

Some who attended these initial meetings were in Lille this summer to see this vision actualized. Dennis noted that, "Some people have been around long enough not just to understand the concepts but to come up with interesting ways to apply them."

Both the *SLT* and the *Business Leadership School (BLS)* Intensives have been held in Berlin and Austria as well. Translations are constantly being expanded and refined to make the curriculums useful in each region.

In August, Jan joined Dennis for the 10th annual Transforum in Biel/ Bienne Switzerland. This is the original Transforum, held in conjunction with *BLS* and *SLT* Intensives. Over 400 people from throughout Europe attended. Using an extensive team of translators, the message was communicated in three languages. The theme was "Building from the Inside Out, and the Bottom Up."

"The Transforum stressed the fact that we cannot expect a transformation of society unless <u>we</u> are being transformed and living a victorious and Christ-like lifestyle," said Hans-Peter Pache, of Berlin.

Impact

The conferences not only had an impact internationally, but also locally.

Walter Duerr, the event organizer, invited area pastors to make the Transforum a joint project. Twelve pastors responded and brought numbers of people from their congregations. The city mayor came to bring a greeting at the conference and was so encouraged, he cancelled other engagements and stayed for the whole day.

Jan shares, "Dennis and I are so encouraged by the work in Europe. Each year the growth in both depth and breadth is evident. Already many in the partnering groups are taking the message to their mission fields. This fruit is proving the principle of growth used for the theme; God does build from the inside out and the bottom up!"

SPIRIT TO SPIRIT

~ Learning to Hear ~

A disciple is one who is listening to the Father amidst the traffic of life and a plethora of people with something to say. The discipline of hearing is a critical tool for disciples because it allows us to know where the Father is working in and around us each day. Hearing requires getting quiet, listening to the right people, applying what is heard, and daily asking the Lord for the ability to hear what he is saying.

What keeps us from hearing? We often listen with a wandering, untrained mind. First, we cannot hear if we are moving too fast and filling our spirits with constant noise. Our culture is driven by demonic influences that demand constant excitation and noise to keep us from slowing down long enough to get quiet.

One of the ways we hear God is by taking a weekly Sabbath day. The purpose of the Sabbath is not to make us holy; it is to make us quiet. Until we quiet down, we cannot evaluate where we have been or prepare ourselves for where we are going. My most precious times before the Lord are times of silence. It is also important that we do not listen to the wrong people. Hearing requires us to know who to hear from, and who not to. When I believe God is saying something to me, I talk about it with my wife, my kids and those I know through revelation or experience are trusted counselors. One of the reasons God gives us relationships is so we can keep what we are hearing in front of others.

What else keeps us from hearing? When we listen, we are listening for good teaching or information; we are not listening to do anything with it. Jesus says if we will do the will of the Father, we will know whether His teachings are true (John 7:17). God often requires the doing before the knowing. We have to listen with an inner ear that says, "Lord Jesus, I want to be a doer of the Word, not just a hearer of the Word."

Listening requires a daily routine. As Isaiah 50:4 says, "He awakens me morning by morning, He awakens my ear to listen as a disciple." We must ask the Lord to give us a hearing ear everyday. We desperately need to hear as disciples in order to do the Father's work on earth.
