GOLIFE WORKSHOP

Fueling the Prophetic Life BY DR. PATTI AMSDEN

- I. Our Father's intention is that we would have a vibrant life that is a result of God speaking to us, us speaking to Him, and us speaking for Him and representing Him.
 - A. In the beginning, Adam fellowshipped and communicated with God.
 - B. Adam sinned and was cast out of God's presence and away from God's council.
 - C. Throughout the Old Covenant, God granted access to His presence and to His council to men called prophets.
 - 1. Micaiah I Kings 22:13-18: "Hear thou therefore the word of the Lord: I saw the Lord sitting on his throne and all the host of heaven standing by him on his right hand and on his left. And the Lord said . . ." (vs. 19, 20a)
 - 2. Elijah I Kings 17:1: "... As the Lord God of Israel lives, before whom I stand, there shall not be dew nor rain these years, but according to my word."
 - 3. Jeremiah 23:21-22: "I have not sent these prophets, yet they ran; I have not spoken to them, yet they prophesied. Yet if they would have stood in my counsel and caused my people to hear my words, then they would have turned them from their evil way and their evil doings"
- II. God's will is to have more than just a few who can sit with God, hear from God, and speak for God; rather God's will is to restore to all the relationship, the intimacy, and the dominion assignment that Adam forfeited.
 - A. Numbers 11:16-30 tells the story of Moses who functioned in a prophetic life, becoming overburdened in his care for the nation of Israel.
 - 1. God directed Moses to gather 70 leaders and God would "take the spirit which is upon you and will put it upon them; and they shall bear the burden of the people with you, and that you bear it not alone." (vs 17)
 - 2. Two men did not gather with the others and yet received the ability to prophesy. Joshua told Moses to forbid them but Moses replied, "Would God that all the Lord's people were prophets and that the Lord would put his spirit upon them." (vs.29)
 - B. The Prophet Joel in Joel 2:28-29 expressed the same sentiment and promised a day when all would be allowed access to a prophetic life: "And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh; and your sons and your daughters

shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions: And also upon the servants and upon the handmaids in those days will I pour out my spirit."

- C. Joel's word was fulfilled at Pentecost as recorded in Acts 2:16-18: "But this is that which was spoken by the prophet Joel; And it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, I will pour out of my Spirit upon all flesh: and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams: And on my servants and on my handmaidens I will pour out in those days of my Spirit; and they shall prophesy."
- D. Jesus death paid the penalty for Adam's transgression, not only removing the death penalty that was on mankind but also readmitting mankind back into God's presence, His throne room, and His council room.
 - 1. Matthew 27:50-51: "Jesus, when he had cried again with a loud voice, yielded up the ghost and behold the veil of the temple was rent in twain from the top to the bottom and the earth did quake, and the rocks rent."
 - 2. Mark 16:19: "So then after the Lord had spoken unto them, he was received up into heaven, and sat on the right hand of God."
 - 3. Ephesians 2:5-6: "Even when we were dead in sins, (God) hath quickened us together with Christ, (by grace ye are saved;) And hath raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus:"
 - 4. The whole body of God's elect has been readmitted and may have a vibrate life of God speaking to us, us speaking to Him, and us speaking for and representing the Lord.
- III. Practicing the presence of God matures us though aligning our hearts with the heart of God and opening our minds to His purposes, thus enabling us to accomplish His will in the earth.
 - A. A devotional life is not ritualistic practices but rather presenting ourselves before the Lord until we receive from Him that which we need to represent Him.
 - B. Isaiah 40:31: "But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint." (Wait = to bind together by twisting)
 - C. The prophetic life is a life of representation and a life where the word and the will of God become incarnate in our flesh.
 - D. The prophetic life is a life where what is seen and heard in God's presence is by faith acted upon in the earth.
 - E. The prophetic life is a life that carries the power, presence, and atmosphere of heaven into the arena of human activity.

Tending Your Garden BY KATHERINE GALLAGHER

"I submit that perhaps the greatest privilege any of us can experience is being a vessel through whom God can express and release His love to someone else. To know God in a deepening relationship is life itself, but to release any portion of His being to another is better yet. Selflessness is the bridge within us God uses to facilitate that exchange. Tending our garden, in an ultimate sense, is having and recognizing a specific set of people God wants to target through us the expression of His love."



God's Method to Change the World: Start in Your Own Garden

- I. How do you change the world? (2 Corinthians 10:13)
 - A. God clearly showed us how to change the world in the beginning. (Genesis 2:15)
 - 1. Change begins from the inside-out and the bottom-up.

-Dennis Peacocke

- 2. One person, sphere of influence, or "garden" at a time.
- B. Who is in your garden?
 - 1. Yourself
 - 2. Your family
 - 3. Your spiritual relationships
 - 4. Your community and the people you regularly interface with (work, neighbors, etc.)
 - 5. Those you see God working with. (John 4:4-42; 5:19)

- C. What does God ask us to do with it?
 - 1. See it (look hard and think about it!).
 - 2. Pray for it—the borders of your ministry are the borders of your prayer life.
 - 3. Cultivate it with word and deed.
 - 4. Use your gifts and tools (what God has given you?).
 - 5. Harvest it and look for added size as you do. (Luke 16:10-12)
 - 6. Teach other believers to work their gardens.

II. Barriers to caring for our gardens:

- A. In a fallen world, the natural condition of the garden is weeds.
 - a. Our fallen self and its perception.
 - b. In regard to tending ourselves: Excuses, fears, and sin.
 - c. In regard to tending others: How do we perceive/relate to those around us?
 - d. Offense with God or with others. (Proverbs 14:9)
 - e. Familiarity: Sometimes we give our worst to those we should be giving our best.
 - 1. Satan and spiritual warfare
 - 2. Condition of the soil and sowing good seed—often its about the condition of the soil not the quality of the seed.
- B. Objections to change (in ourselves & others):
 - 1. "I don't believe I can change" (past failures; goals set and missed).
 - 2. "I don't want to change" (dealing with "friendly sins" or deception).

- 3. "I am angry at God or someone and rebel against change."
- 4. "I don't know how to change" (feeling trapped).
- C. Four major principles that lead to change:
 - 1. Change begins with a genuine hunger for truth and reality.
 - 2. Change is usually precipitated by a crisis we successfully work through.
 - 3. Lasting change requires coaches and pastors to help train us into how to hold the change by correct practice and knowing what to reject.
 - 4. Real change must be practiced until becomes a reflex. (Deuteronomy 6:4-9; Proverbs 6:20-23)
- D. How to cultivate and represent change:
 - 1. Attitude: Get in the big picture and stay in it.
 - 2. Action: Take ownership of God's spiritual principles and practice them daily.
 - 3. Experience: Know what you know and build your testimony.
 - 4. Opportunity: Seize daily opportunities to bring transformation into your sphere of influence.
 - 5. Worship: Enjoy God working in you and with you.

Building for Success BY DENNIS PEACOCKE

- I. Our first task is to attempt to define "success" from an eternal rather than temporal point of view.
 - A. Success is fulfilling God's plans for us on earth: Obedience
 - 1. Stewarding our gifts with increase (stewardship).
 - 2. Fulfilling our representation of Christ to the people and tasks He has called us to (destiny).
 - 3. Developing the character and skill sets God has called us to begin to master for our eternal calling of leadership (eternal growth). 1 Cor.3:9-15; John 5:17.
 - B. This "success" must be achieved by:
 - 1. <u>Working in faith</u> at whatever we are called to do rather than for the simple reasons of money, power, peer pressure or college degrees (Heb. 11:6).
 - 2. The money and resources we gather should be "satisfaction resources" not "anxiety-driven" money.
 - 3. To do these things, we must answer two all-important questions: "What must I do before I die;" and "How do I give myself to eternal skill sets and working with the Holy Spirit moment by moment?"
 - C. Remember, God plays everyone who is in shape. "Success" is in living in the training to succeed.
 - 1. He isn't looking for "perfect people", He is looking for people who are in training (being discipled) with the Holy Spirit.
 - 2. He plays us according to our level of preparation. (competency, the opposition, God as the "fight manager")

- 3. Offense, not just defense. Here are the questions again:
 - a. What level do you want to play?
 - b. What does it take to play at that level?
 - c. What will it cost for you to get there?
- D. God uses us to bring transformation to people and situations based on certain spiritual laws. He has established.
 - 1. We can only bring true and lasting transformation to people if we ourselves are in the transformation we are advocating (the law of measles and mumps).
 - 2. In a fallen world, the only ultimate question is, "how do we experience lasting transformation that grows and is transferable to others?"
 - 3. All players look for competent coaches, and aspire to become a competent coach themselves.

II. We must learn to build God's way:

- A. The "Big Three:"
 - 1. How God builds strategically (how to live, think, lead, and build strategically)
 - 2. How God builds relationally (how to build relationally, according to Christ's patterns)
 - 3. How God builds learning organizations (how to create a learning-response team of people)
- B. The BLS curriculum deals with all three of these issues.
 - 1. Firstly, as we develop a Christian worldview in general and in these areas relating to business economics.
 - 2. Secondly, as we develop applicational skills.

GOLIFE WORKSHOP

Building Generationally BY DR. PATTI AMSDEN

This teaching focuses on the importance of building generationally, recognizing the progress that results from generational transfer, and outlining the process of maturing the next generation. It is important because continuity from one generation to another is God's plan for the advancement of His Kingdom and the sustainable development of the culture.

- I. God's preferred process of advancing the earth and His work in the earth is accomplished through continuity rather than through discontinuity.
 - A. In Deuteronomy 6:4-9, which is known as the Shema Israel, God calls upon natural families to insure that each preceding generation instructs and prepares the succeeding generation.
 - 1. The background of Deuteronomy and the Shema Israel is the discontinuity of the Egyptian exodus and the continuity promised in the land of inheritance.
 - 2. The Passover, which was the commemoration of the Exodus deliverance, was celebrated with unleavened bread (Exodus 12:12-20; Leviticus 23:5-8); but Pentecost, which was the commemoration of the giving of the law at Mt. Sinai, was celebrated with leavened bread (Leviticus 23:15-17).
 - 3. Leaven represents any belief system that gives rise to a culture.
 - 4. Discontinuity is a radical action to cut off that which must not be allowed to move into exponential growth.
 - 5. Moses commanded fathers to pass onto their sons the Kingdom leaven which would guarantee the continuation of the nation's worship system and the progressive advancement of the culture.
 - B. In Ephesians 4:11-16, Paul reveals that God has given the five-fold ministry gifts to function within the church in a similar and parallel role as parents function within the family.
 - 1. The five-fold imparts truth and oversees application of that truth in order to leaven the saints for the work of the leavening the culture with the Kingdom.
 - 2. The end-goal of the leavening process for the church is that the body of Christ matures from children to the measure of the stature of Christ.
 - 3. The five-fold is responsible for continuity from generation to generation.
 - C. The Shema outlines training unto maturation.
 - 1. "The Lord our God is one Lord" emphasizes an integrated rather than fragmented view of life.

- 2. "Love the Lord you God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might" describes no fragmented affections of the heart.
- 3. "Teach them (the laws) diligently unto your children" accentuates no fragmented source of the leaven.
- 4. "Talk of them when you sit in your house, and walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when your rise up" means to build a worldview by discussing everyday events through the lenses of God's Word.
- 5. "Bind them for a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes" denotes that the whole soul of man and all forms of his labors are manifesting the influence of a biblical worldview.
- 6. "Write them upon the posts of your house and on your gates" signifies the building of the culture of family and social institutions based upon the culture of the Kingdom.
- II. The goal of bringing sons to maturity who are prepared to manage the inheritance is a main theme seen throughout the scriptures.
 - A. Adam, God's son, was perfectly created but not fully mature, and he introduced the first radical discontinuity found in the Bible and disrupted generational continuity.
 - B. Jesus, God's only-begotten son, brought discontinuity to the generational transfer of death and introduced continuity with the leaven of the Kingdom.
 - C. Israel's three rites of passage addressed the process of generational transfer through the process of maturation.
 - 1. Circumcision on the eighth day spoke of birth into a covenantal lineage.
 - 2. Bar Mitzvah at twelve years of age acknowledged the completion of training in the law or the leavening of the child's world view.
 - 3. Huiothesia at the age of thirty denoted the transfer of management rights to a mature son who was thoroughly prepared for management of the inheritance.
 - D. The story of Elijah and Elisha in II Kings 2:1-14 demonstrates the steps that must be secured for continuity of the generations to be attained and the reward of generational transfer to be granted.
 - 1. Gilgal, which means "rolling," solidifies that the son is in the covenant.
 - 2. Bethel, which means "house of God," defines the worship and seat of spiritual life.
 - 3. Jericho, which means "fragrance," expresses that all earthly works are motivated by and dedicated to the advancement of the Kingdom.
 - 4. Jordan, meaning "to descend," represents the transfer and coming into the new day.
 - E. Elisha received a double portion, which is an indication that generational transfer not only secures the future but advances the power, authority, and influence of the Kingdom.


